Mondays

Coffee and Chat

Sighted Guiding Training

On Tuesday 6th May we will be offering a session on Sighted Guiding. This training is for anyone over the age of 18 who wants to learn how to guide an adult with sight loss.

This training will equip you with the skills and knowledge to safely and confidently guide people with sight loss. The training will cover communication, basic guiding techniques ranging from how to walk together to navigating doorways to staircases. You will also receive an awareness of common barriers and access rights.

Whether you have been guiding someone confidently for years or are completely new to the role, this is the perfect opportunity to develop your skills and use best practice when guiding.
